# Pastor's Page



## ***“Shaken and Stirred”***

“We’re still here! We’ll be here until the very end!” It sounded as if my new friends were expecting the apocalypse. They were waiting for their son to run the 4 x 400 at the SBC Championships. Same difference. It’s the very... last... race of the night. My daughter was also running the 4 x 400. I could feel their pain. Over 5 hours of sitting on bleachers tested the tailbones of all who awaited the dreaded 4 x 400. When I saw their son race, I discovered that the wait was worth it. The incredible happened.

This young high school student started to warm up and his mom who was “still here” got up, walked down to the handrail, right up against the track, and watched. I don’t mean that she simply looked, or observed. I mean to say that she watched with intensity. If she looked away from her son, it was just for a moment, then back again, like her attention was necessary, sustaining.

She clapped and cheered as he lined up. She clapped and cheered when he was well out of range to take notice. Then when the race ended, she did the same. He was second to last. Her son walked off the track. He put on his warm ups and started to talk to one person after another as he began making his way across the field, away from his mother. This, in itself, isn’t remarkable. What happened next was.

His mother didn’t move. She didn’t break her gaze. She didn’t converse with anyone or come back up into the stands. She stood exactly where she was, as close to her son as possible, watching. Every couple of minutes she would clap for him again, almost as an impulse- an eruption of sorts from inside. In those moments, there was no discernible reason for her celebration. Her son was completely unaware. The race was over. Yet she stared like every second mattered. She did this for nearly 15 minutes before finally moving away from the track.

Moving to her husband’s side, I asked about what I had seen. Just two months previous to this race, their son’s leg suddenly swelled to nearly double in size. They were shocked to hear what doctors found a large blood clot in his leg. They knew what this meant. They knew they could lose their son at any moment. He was a high school student, young, healthy, and now this? The doctors removed the clot and put in a stint. A second clot filled the stint. They operated again, and this... was his first race back.

I can’t help but to think that there are times when we feel like we’re running a race we didn’t have time to prepare for. Times when the unexpected comes for us, twice over, threatening. We may feel like we’re near last place, while giving everything we have. We cannot forget that God, like this mother, isn’t just observing. He’s intently watching, celebrating... Even when we’re unaware and running, hearing nothing but the wind in our ears, God is breathing into our lungs and sustaining because every second counts.

May we never forget that God is “still here.” He’ll be here “until the very end.”

## Congratulations to the 2022 Sharon Neifer Memorial Scholarship recipients Camryn Ivy & Marcus Overmyer



## Rummage




