

“Beautiful Flowers”

The desert in Las Vegas is beautiful. Mountains jut into the sky. Rocks of multiple colors and densities line the faces of cliffs. It's incredible. There's an ever-present impulse to reach out and touch the scenery.

Then there's the plants.

It's as if every plant in Las Vegas grew up in the town of hard knocks. Limited water, dust, rocky ground and high heat forged these things into something penitentiary-worthy. They don't move. You move. They have their space and if you come onto their turf, you get shanked.

My friend has a name for the blossoming barbed wire that grows all around the area, “murder plants.” He ain't kidding.

While hiking, I saw a tunnel far up the side of a steep mountain face. At high elevation, I decided to climb and explore. Along the way, I found this beautifully flowered plant. Stopping for a moment, I took a few photos for my daughters before attempting to reposition myself for a different camera angle. The rocks shifted beneath my feet and I slid directly into the flowery wonder. I'm pretty sure I heard it speak.

“Who's frontin'!? Law don't go round' here!” Then he shanked me repeatedly. He sliced to-and-fro, his beautiful, flowery head bobbing back and forth.

Multiple barbs shot through my shoe, into my foot and directly into my ankle and shin. Fortunately, his reach was short so he missed the vital organs. The scuffle happened so quickly that in the intensity of the fight, I somehow ripped off one of his “arms.”

I think we were both shocked at the worthiness of our opponent. After a flurry of activity, we paused for a moment and stared at one another. Without another word, I could see that we mutually agreed the fight was over. Some might think it was a draw, but if you ask my crew, I totally won.

I put a notch in my belt to mark the victory. He put about 138 notches in my leg. Every day for a week, I discovered new little barbs shoved up into my foot.

But here's the good news: I got some great photos.

It appears to me that to see the greatest beauty up-close and personal, it costs something. Jesus may stand at the door and knock, but we still have to seek to find, and obey to truly know. The effort to earnestly seek, and the difficulty in bending our wills in an attempt to get close to something “good” can take everything we have. In faith, we drive forward, not knowing what will be disclosed. However, when it happens... when we finally see, we understand. Amazed at the beauty of what could only be experienced after climbing the rocky crag, we sit in awe. In that moment, we dwell in the beauty. Every time we remember, we confirm that the sacrifice was worth it and the results are forever ours. Then we look up the mountain a little further for the next place we need to reach to “see.”

Empty shoeboxes will be available at the back of the sanctuary beginning October 2nd, and filled shoeboxes may be brought in at any point during the collection period. Our church

PACK A SHOEBOX

goal is to fill 100 shoeboxes for children this year, spreading the word of God during the Christmas season. An online goal page has been set up at SamaritansPurse.org and can be referenced on that website as the Lindsey Trinity Goal Page. The church goal page will allow you to make direct online donations towards the \$10 shipping fee per box being sent from our church, or a donation for the ministry of discipleship which shoebox recipients are offered. You may actually build your shoebox totally online now to be sent to a boy or a girl around the world for just \$25, which covers the cost of the contents you select and the shipping. A team member from Samaritan's Purse will shop for the items you select and pack it for shipping. You will find this option available online at samaritanspurse.org/buildonline.

When selecting items to include in your shoebox please keep in mind a suggested "wow" item (such as a soccer ball with pump, a doll or stuffed animal, musical instrument, shoes, or a special clothing item), as well as small toys (like a yo-yo, toy cars, jump ropes, travel sized games, or card games), non-liquid hygiene items (multiple toothbrushes: as families do share, bar soap, washcloths, combs and brushes are a few suggestions), school supplies (ideas are: small notebooks, pencils with a sharpener, pens, crayons or markers, coloring or picture books, solar calculators, and paper – which is erased and reused many times), and accessories (such as socks, hats, sunglasses, hair bows bands or clips, watches or fun jewelry, flashlights with batteries, and water bottles). Please remember to include batteries for anything battery operated like a flashlight, toy or game as batteries are not readily available in many areas of the world. Many of the children share their shoebox gifts with family members so small sewing or fishing items are welcome presents for the entire family as are sturdy small bags to carry foods, grains or books. Homemade items which are sewn, carved, crocheted or knitted are treasured gifts! Shoeboxes are sent to more than 100 counties worldwide, and to many climates so you may choose to focus your box selections for a warm dry climate or a cold mountainous climate. Including a personal note or a picture from you or your family makes your caring and faith even more real to a child. A more inclusive list of gift suggestions is available at samaritanspurse.org/occ. *Please do NOT include toothpaste, candy, gum, used or damaged items, war-related items, seeds, food, liquids, lotion, vitamins, medication, aerosol cans, or breakable items.*

Please remember that God sends each shoebox into the life of a child. Each child is then blessed with a 12 gospel lesson discipleship program designed to help each youth spread God's word to their families and neighbors! The discipleship course titled "The Greatest Journey" has even inspired a free app which is available at samaritanspurse.org/tgj-app. If you or your family would like to experience the Bible stories inspired by this discipleship program which is offered to children receiving your shoebox gifts, then access the Samaritans Purse website for the app today. Please consider packing a shoebox or donating towards the shipment of the church shoeboxes this season and add this mission and those it touches to your regular prayers. During the last 10 years 8.9 million children made decisions for Christ and 9.7 million committed to pray for and share their faith with family and friends!
