adventures. There's only one recorded event of any student dying from a fall at Oxford, which took place in 1976. Even in that instance, no connection to the night climber's secret society could be found.

The fear is real. The risk is real. They must be. It's the only thing that assures that their courage is real. They don't climb for others. They climb to prove to themselves that they are capable, as they reach places few others have ever been.

## "Oxford Smarts"

"Dad, I think I want to study at Oxford for a couple semesters."

"'Oxford' as in, 'Oxford University' as in 'Oxford, England,' the place where CS Lewis taught for 30 years?"

Yes, that Oxford. Study abroad programs seemed to make that potential a real possibility for her. Outside of the fact that my favorite author taught there, and very intelligent people attended, I didn't know much about the university. I decided to do some digging. I discovered something I didn't expect... night climbers.

For a century a secret society of climbers have gathered in the middle of the night to free-solo buildings across Oxford's campus. A reporter hunted for these climbers. Finally, at 1:32am he discovered four "shadowy" characters on top of a building and was able to interview them. Their story was fascinating. "Leave no trace" was their motto, meaning "do no damage to buildings." Of course, the greatest damage could be theirs to bear.

A single mistake could cost them. They plan a climb during the day, remember the route, climb in the dark, all while considering escape routes to avoid authorities, only to ultimately stay silent about their

Is it smart? These students are brilliant. A man once told me, "Cost only matters in the absence of value." If the value is there, the cost is worth it.

If you follow Christ, God could "call" you to action at any moment. There will likely be an expense- time, energy, money and more. Some would mock it as "silly," a high-rise climb in the dark, totally unnecessary, given the options. It's a cost too high. Is that possible, given the value of a relationship with God? He's the Alpha and the Omega, our only hope, friend and savior. He is the truth and the king of all. He is our "everything." When all else passes, He remains.

Living for Him may seem as smart as climbing a university spire in the middle of a dark night, until you consider the value of what is gained.
